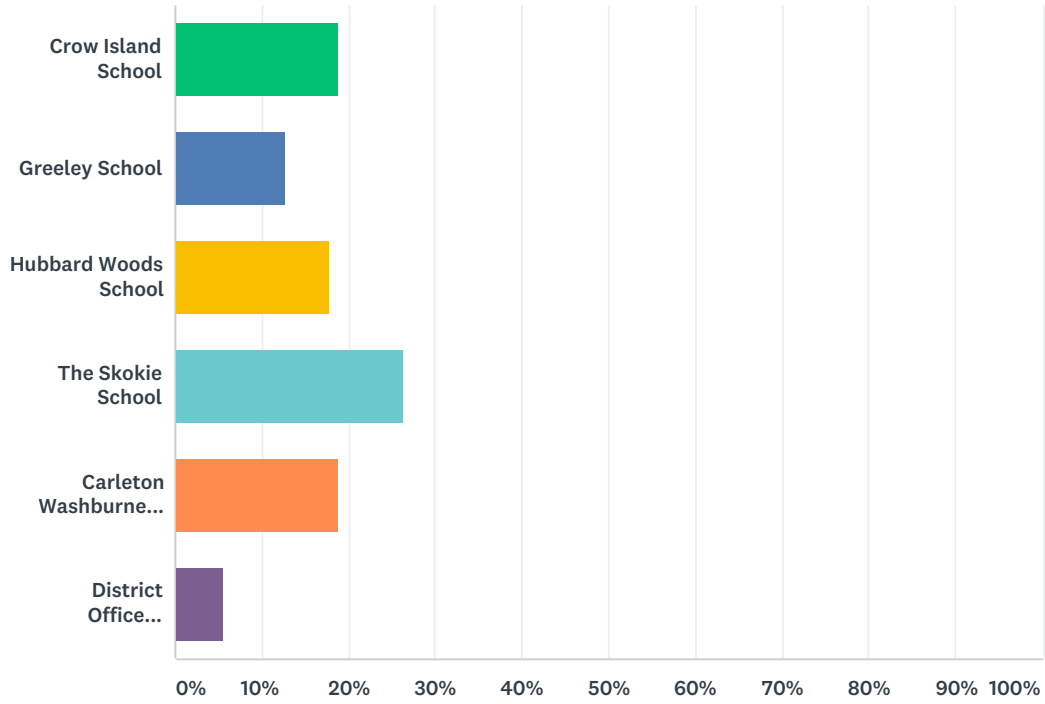

## Q1 At which site do you primarily work?

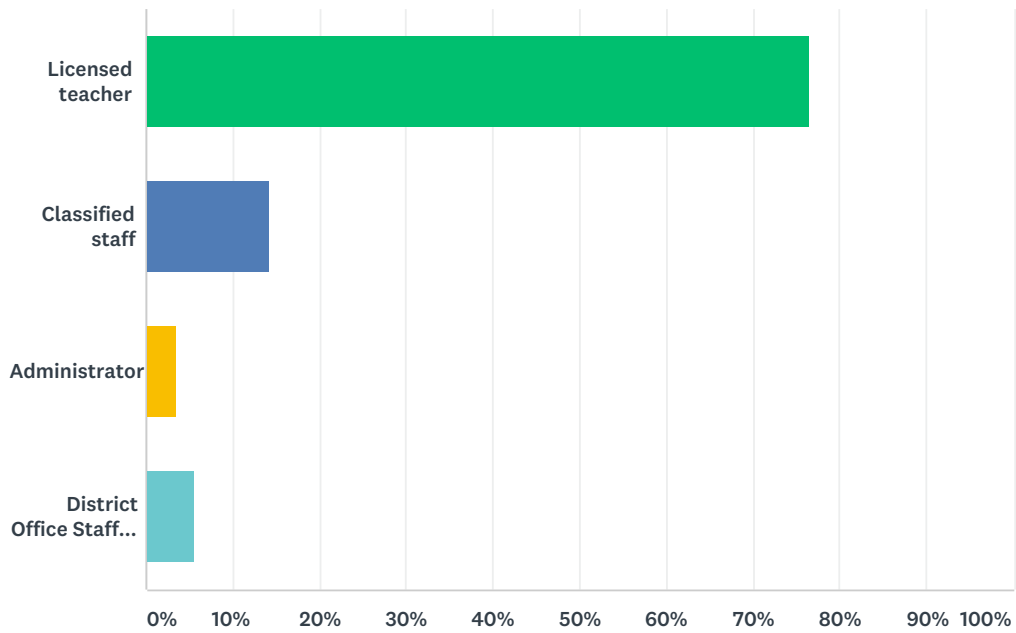

## Q2 Which of the following best describes your role at The Winnetka Public Schools?

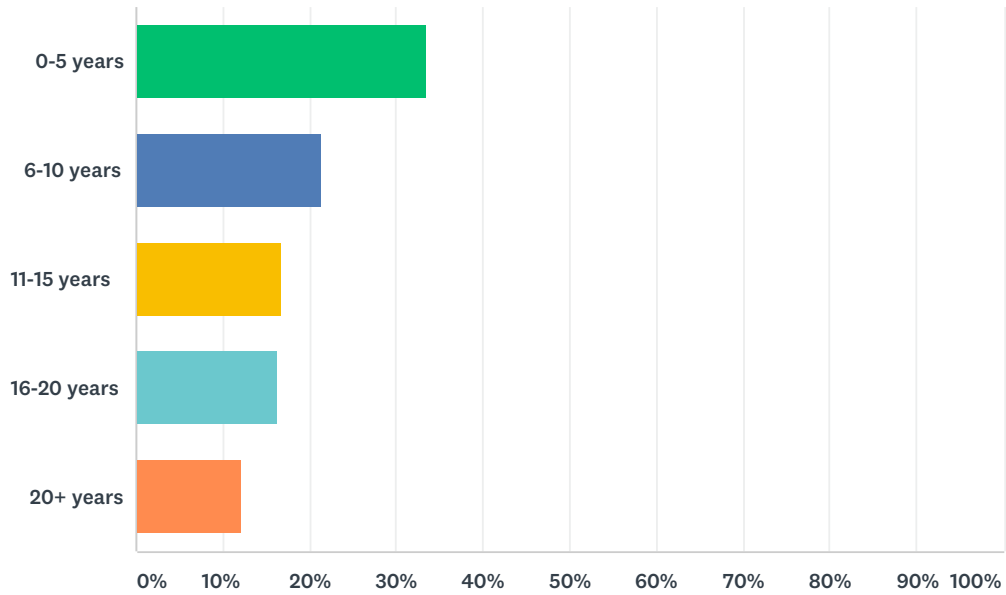

### Q3 How long have you been an employee of The Winnetka Public Schools?

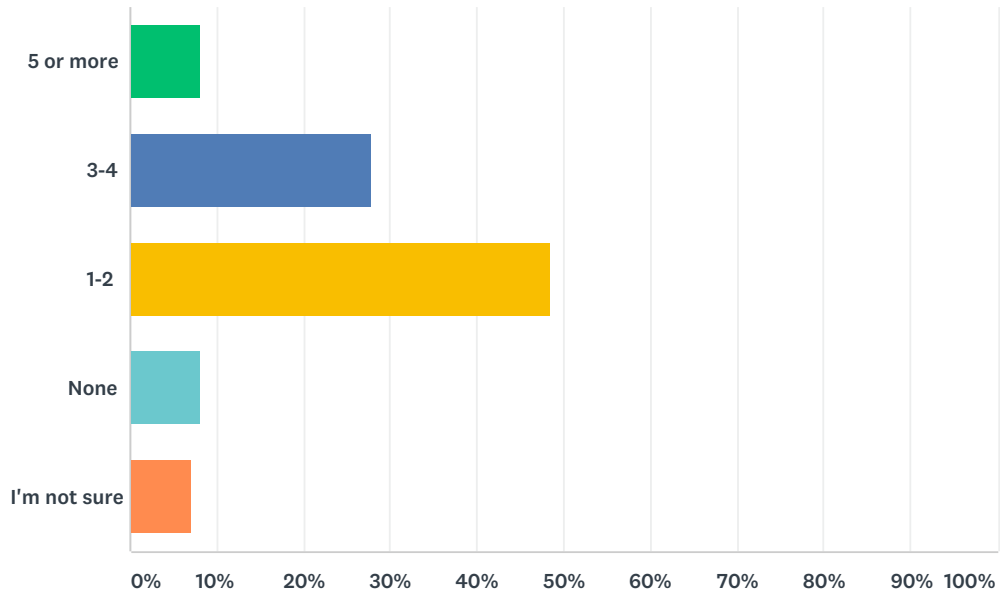

## Q4 How many events have you attended to learn about Future Ready D36? (i.e. School Board Meetings and presentations)

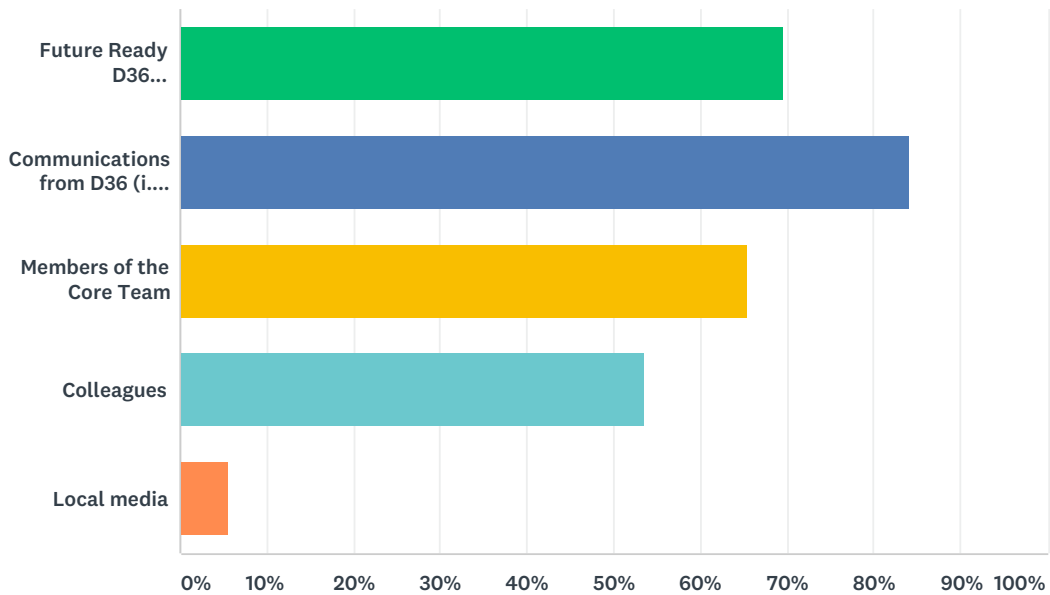

## Q5 What are your primary sources of information for Future Ready D36 planning? Please choose all that apply.

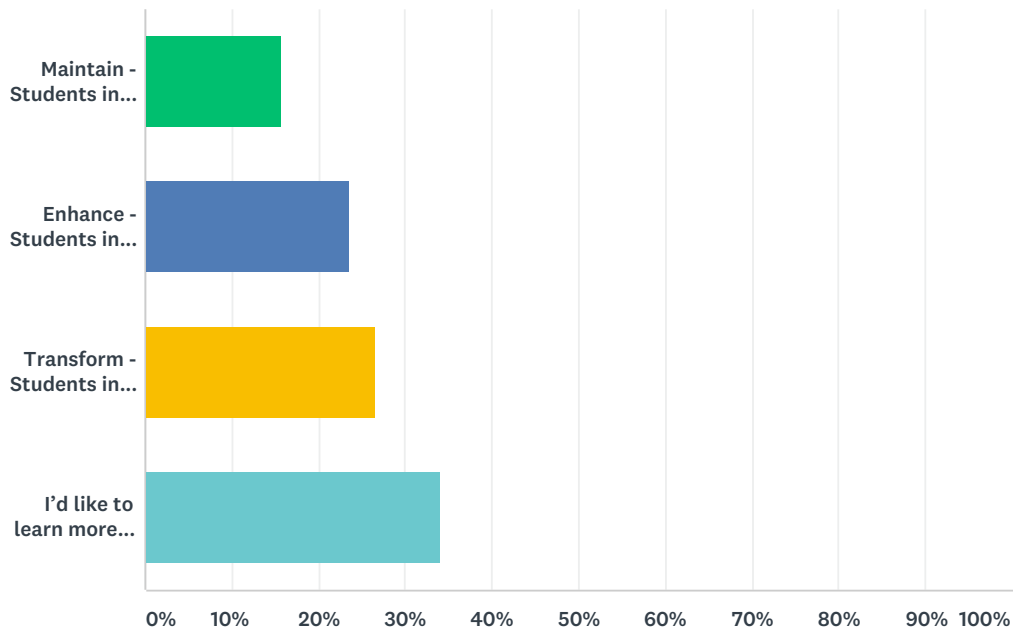

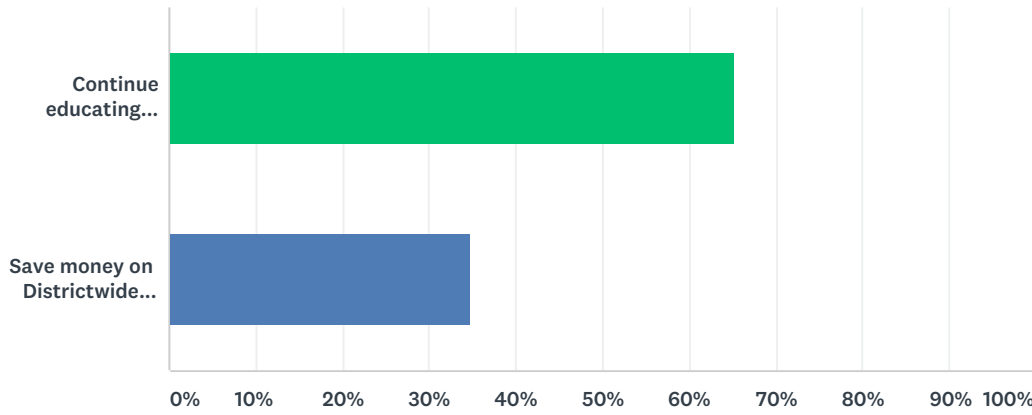

Maintain - Students in grades K-4 would attend neighborhood elementary schools. The current enrollment imbalance would be addressed by shifting attendance boundaries. Cost savings would be realized by closing The Skokie School and moving grades 5 and 6 to Carleton Washburne School. This concept includes additional cafeteria and kinetic wellness spaces at each building and does not include any classroom or future ready renovations.	15.61% 27
Enhance - Students in grades K-3 would attend neighborhood elementary schools. The current enrollment imbalance would be addressed by shifting attendance boundaries. Cost savings would be realized by closing The Skokie School. Grades 4-8 would attend Carleton Washburne School, with expanded grade level wings containing future ready improvements. This concept includes additional cafeteria and kinetic wellness spaces at each building. Carleton Washburne School would be the only building with future ready renovations.	23.70% 41
Transform - Students in grades K-1 would attend a grade level center at Crow Island School. The current enrollment imbalance would be addressed by educating students in grades 2-8 in a new facility on the grounds of The Skokie School, with future ready design around the preserved Skokie School exterior facade, entryway, and auditorium. Cost savings would be realized by closing Hubbard Woods and Greeley Schools, which would remain District property but either be repurposed or serve rental organizations. Carleton Washburne School (except the gymnasium) would be decommissioned.	26.59% 46

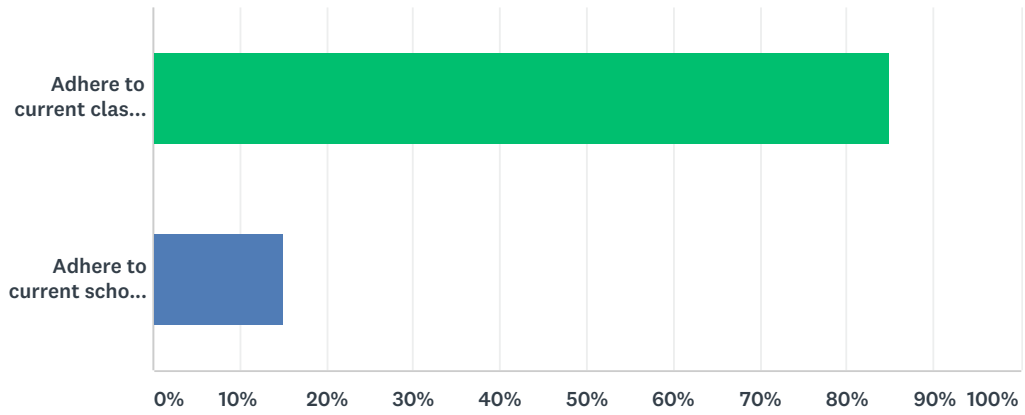

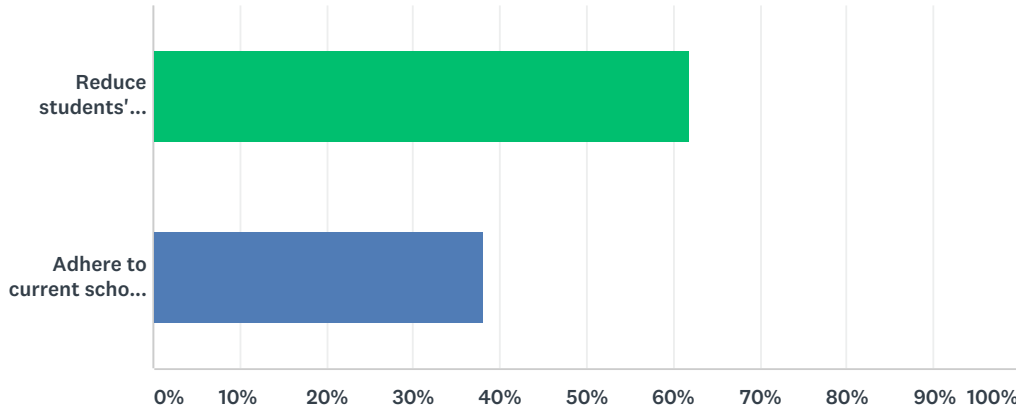

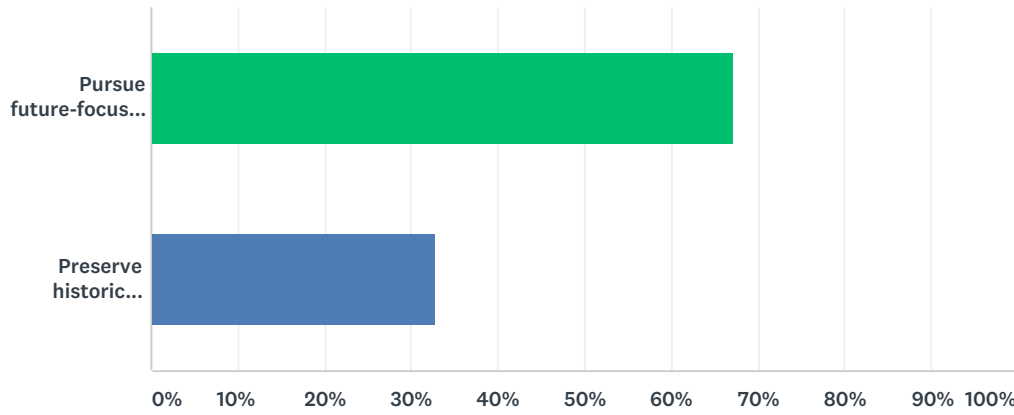

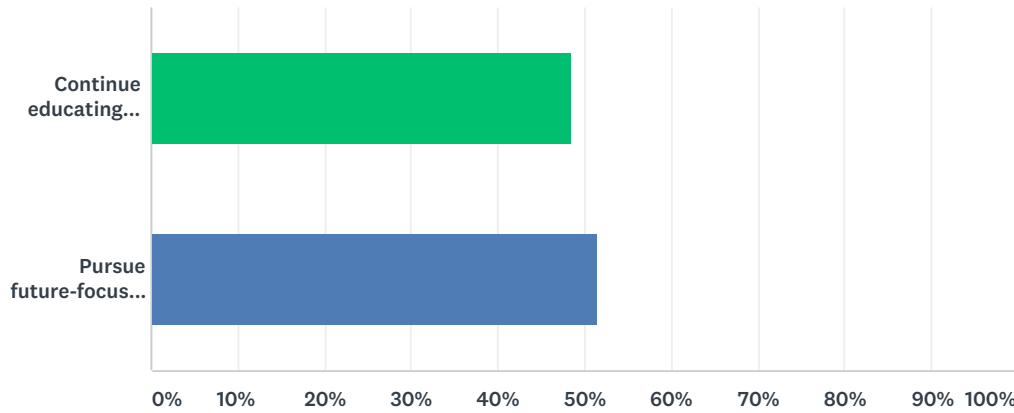
