

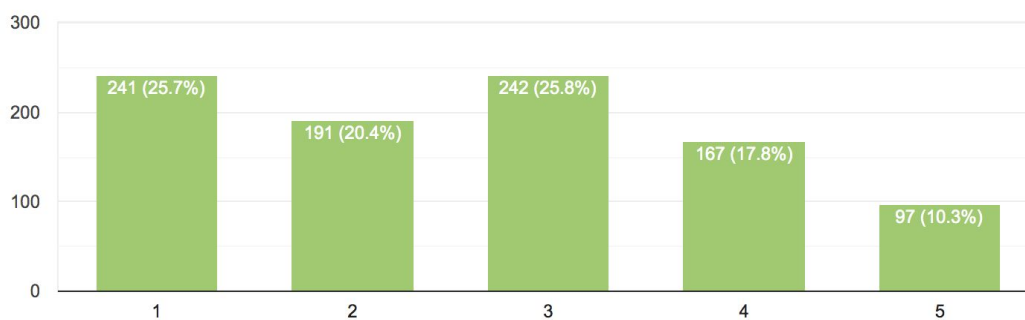


July 2020 Parent Survey Analysis At-a-Glance

938 respondents

- 92% of respondents indicated they plan to send their child(ren) to school in-person in the fall (inclusive of 5% who qualified as only if certain conditions are met).
- 8% of respondents indicated that they are interested in a remote learning option
 - 76% said they are not comfortable sending their child to school at this time, and 25% noted that their family or child has a medical condition which would prevent them from attending school in person
- Based on public health data during the survey window (July 17-23) families were asked about their comfort level for sending their child to school (with 1 being the lowest level of concern and 5 being the highest).

Responses ranged as follows:



- Families were asked if they were willing to pay an increased fee for transportation in order to meet safety standards.
 - 3% indicated that they are willing to pay an increased fee.
 - 7% indicated that they are not able to make this decision at this time.

- When asked about which area children may have the most difficulty transitioning back to school in the fall,
 - 45% of respondents indicated academically
 - 30% of respondents indicated emotionally
 - 22% of respondents indicated social interaction
 - 3% of respondents indicated other areas of concern
